

	Fabric A 28881 R ½ YARD		Fabric B 28880 H ½ YARD		Fabric C 28879 E ½ YARD
<p>Additional materials needed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Pom Pom Fringe: ¾ yd of 1" wide (optional) - ½" Snap - 16" Pillow form 					

We recommend that you carefully read through all instructions before getting started on your project.

INSTRUCTIONS

Use a $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowance throughout.

1. Cut (1) 17" x 17" square from **Fabric A** for front of pillow.
2. Cut (1) 17" x 17" square from **Fabric C** for back of pillow.
3. For the envelope top, cut (2) 17" x 10" **Fabric B** pieces. Fold these 2 pieces in half and draw a line from the bottom outside corner to the top center fold line. Cut on this line, you will have two large triangles.

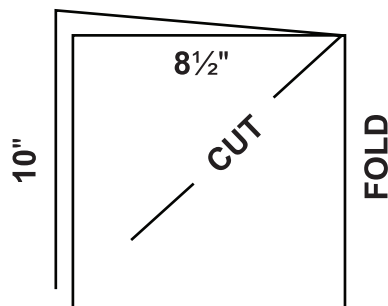

4. Open the triangles, lay right sides together and stitch along the angled sides. Do not sew the bottom. Turn and press with iron on cotton setting (up/down motion, no steam).

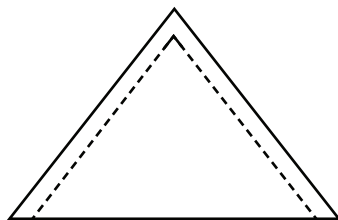

5. Place the envelope top on the right side of the **Fabric C** 17" x 17" square with raw edges together and stitch across.

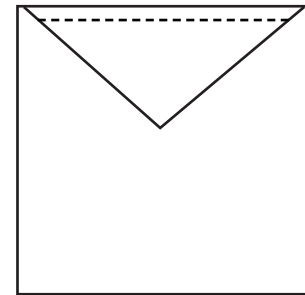


ILLUSTRATION 3

6. Press $\frac{1}{2}$ " along the top of the **Fabric A** square to obtain a $\frac{1}{4}$ " finished hem.

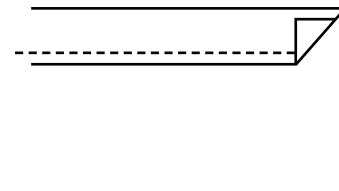

7. With right sides sew the pillow front to the pillow back on 3 sides, leaving open at top.

8. Turn and press seam allowance of the triangle to inside of pillow cover. Turn the front panel to the inside and top stitch around the pillow cover opening.

9. Hand sew snap to inside of envelope about $1\frac{1}{2}$ " from point. Hand sew other side of snap to corresponding point on the pillow.

10. Iron or hand stitch the applique over the snap stitches on the front (optional).

11. Hand stitch the optional pom pom fringe to the triangle flap.

12. Insert the pillow form and snap closed.
